The aim of the programme is to help students deepen their knowledge and gain understanding of global politics. The programme seeks to provide the necessary skills for actively engaging in academic and professional discussions about the contemporary international community in an interdisciplinary manner, by combining the disciplines of international politics, international law and international economics
